Luca is in kindergarten and is, unsurprisingly, just being Luca. He's making lots of friends, is adored by the older kids, and attends a small public Montessori school with fewer than 20 students total. His classroom is a K-2 mix, and he especially loves learning letters and math.

Zara has truly come out of her shell this year, and it's been such a joy to watch her confidence grow. First grade suits her well, and her class is pen pals with Aunt Audrey Hickinbotham's 1st grade class at Mansfield Christian School in Ohio! Zara's making great friends, losing teeth at an impressive rate, and also loves math.

The holiday season brings a mix of emotions. We miss family and friends back in Ohio, and the kids feel it especially when cousins celebrate birthdays or special moments without them. At the same time, they are building deep friendships here in Montana and growing in confidence and independence. It's been sweet to watch them put down roots while still holding their people close in their hearts.



At the end of November, we were able to travel back to Ohio to celebrate Thanksgiving with family. It was especially meaningful as it was our first holiday back since we moved to Montana, and Mr. Alex's first Thanksgiving without work responsibilities! Sharing the holiday with both sides of the family, along with an evening of friends and games, was a true gift and a highlight of the season.



There have been several meaningful milestones worth celebrating as we head into this season. This fall, Mr. Alex sat for his licensing examination and is now an Official Worker with the Christian and Missionary Alliance. This affirms his calling and role in vocational ministry and allows him to serve more fully within the denomination through leadership, preaching, and ministry development; something we're deeply grateful for.



Mrs. Alex has continued offering family photography sessions for friends and new clients through word of mouth, and finally admitted this fall that she truly missed doing it more than she realized. With that clarity, she's begun laying the groundwork for a fuller relaunch in 2026. She's also started volunteering at our church, helping with social media, an enjoyable way to serve and stay creatively engaged.



Looking ahead, the next few months will be full. Mr. Alex will be traveling frequently for summer staff recruiting, building partnerships with churches, speaking engagements, conferences, and ongoing relationship development. At home, Luca will begin attending school four days a week instead of three, and the kids are slowly acquiring ski gear; an important rite of passage for Montana life! Winter also means plenty of tubing events at camp, which never fails to be a highlight for all of us.


